**December** Ikebana International participated in the Christmas Greens Show of the National Capital Area Federation of Garden Clubs at the U.S. Botanic Gardens by making origami ornaments to decorate the ikebana tree.

**January** Diana Cull and Ruth O'Donnell presented a Sogetsu demonstration titled "Festive Arrangements in Red and White" at the winter general workshop.

**February** New member coffee held after the Board meeting.

The Board voted to permanently change the January workshop to February and the February luncheon to March.
